The May OAL Monthly Meeting Presenter is Jong Hong Zhong



Our meeting will begin with mingling and critiquing our art from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m. Business agenda will be from 7:00-7:30 p.m. and then just following our business agenda Jong Hong Zhong will present via Zoom which can be viewed from home or at the Lacey Community Center.



Yong Hong Zhong was born in Canton, China and immigrated to the United States when he was twelve years old. Yong developed a keen interest in drawing at an early age. His determination to pursue his dream of being an artist prompted him to attend La Guardia High School, a prestigious school for music and arts in New York City. Yong continued his education at Pratt Institute in New York to further develop his artistic skills. He majored in Illustration and has a minor in Art History.

Yong started working for the Disney Animation Studios upon graduation. During his fourteen years employment at Disney, Yong had worked on over a dozen theatrical feature films. After completion of Disney's "The Princess and the Frog", Yong was ready to take a different direction and focus on his passion for traditional painting. The knowledge and experiences he acquired from the animation industry continue to be an invaluable influence in his art. Yong has been a fulltime fine art painter since 2009. Hello Fellow Artists,

I am looking forward to "En Plein Air" painting this summer. En Plein Air is a French expression meaning "in the open air." Google translation "outdoors".

When you paint outdoors, you're engaging directly with the beauty of the natural world. It also teaches you to paint quickly.

PAINTING OUTSIDE

1 Choose a Portable Easel: A lightweight, compact easel or pochade box is necessary for plein air painting.

2 Pack Essentials Only: Only bring the colors and brushes necessary for your painting. A smaller palette can encourage simplicity.

3 Bring a Sketchbook: A sketchbook is helpful for planning your composition before committing it to canvas.

4 Be Prepared for the Weather: The elements can affect your painting process. Know the weather forecast and prepare accordingly with a hat, coat, or umbrella.

5 Embrace Change: The lighting and scene will change as you paint. Instead of fighting it, embrace it.




Guest Artists for June and July! Southwest Chapter of "Women Painters of Washington Exhibition " June 3rd – July 31st
